

ASU (GLG 494/598) & UNR (701J): Final presentations

When: On May 3 and 5, we will have final in-class presentations.

What: You can choose to present on either your first or second mapping project- or a combination of both. Include similar information to what is in your reports— datasets that you used and a discussion of 1-2 interesting areas in detail. Tell the class what is important about your area, the challenges, and what you learned in your mapping.

Length: Each student will have a total of 7 minutes. The presentation should last 5 minutes. It is important to leave at least 2 minutes of time for questions. In order to get through all of the presenters in time, the presentations will be cut off at the end of 5 minutes, so it is important to plan and time yourself before.

Audience: Your audience is your classmates. What do you anticipate is interesting and important about your project to someone who mapped a different area?

Asking questions: Each student should ask at least one question during the presentations.

Suggestions: Practice your talk several times in advance. Your presentation will be better for this extra effort. In the end, have fun with this activity. These presentations are our last class meetings and a fun opportunity to show what you have worked hard on over the semester. It is up to you to decide how to introduce the project to the class in order to make the presentation clear and understandable for your audience.
